Letty : See you tomorrow Mrs Porter!



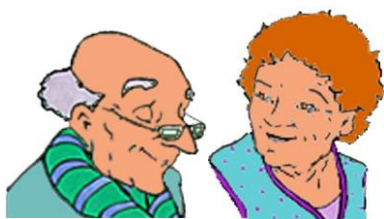
Ginny Porter :

Letty Posty: *Indiscretion!*



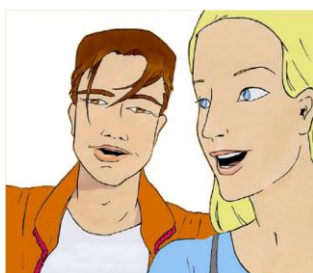
