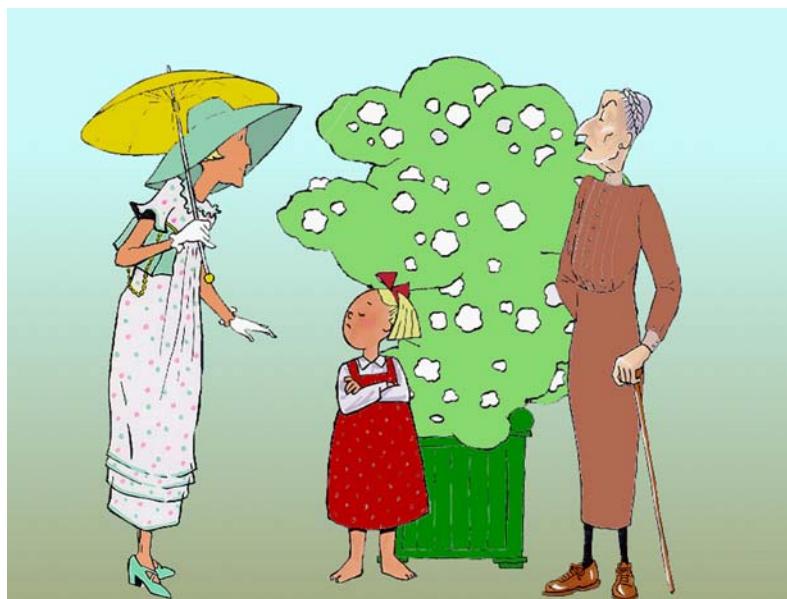


Nan is capricious: A difficult young lady ...
